f Faith That Endures

Text: Hebrews 11:1–6 **Theme:** Biblical faith is not passive belief—it is active endurance rooted in God's promises, proven in adversity, and rewarded by God Himself.

I. Q What Faith Is: The Biblical Definition

Hebrews 11:1 "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

- Faith is spiritual certainty, not emotional optimism.
- It anchors the soul in unseen realities revealed by God.



II. Taith That Pleases God

Hebrews 11:6 "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him."

- Faith is the only approach that pleases God.
- It believes in His character and pursues Him with confidence.



III. Faith That Walks Without Sight

2 Corinthians 5:7 "For we walk by faith, not by sight."

Romans 8:24–25 "For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope... But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it."

- Faith moves forward even when the path is unclear.
- It waits patiently for what God has promised.







IV. X Faith That Endures Trials

James 1:2–4 "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience."

1 Peter 1:7 "That the trial of your faith... might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ."

- Trials are not signs of failure—they are the forge of endurance.
- God refines faith through fire, not ease.



V. 👑 Faith That Receives the Reward

2 Timothy 4:7–8 "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness..."

Hebrews 10:35–36 "Cast not away therefore your confidence... For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise."

- Enduring faith is rewarded—not just in heaven, but in legacy.
- God honors those who finish well.



Legacy Reflection

Lesson 2



→ Faith That Is Obediant

Text: Hebrews 11:7; Genesis 6:5–22

I. **God's Warning to Noah**

Hebrews 11:7 "By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark..."

Genesis 7:1 "Come thou and all thy house into the ark..."

Hebrews 11:7 (continued) "...by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith."

- Noah's obedience saved his family and preserved righteousness.
- Faith leaves a legacy—not just of survival, but of spiritual inheritance.



Legacy Reflection

Noah didn't just build an ark—he built a testimony. His obedience became a dividing line between judgment and salvation. In a world that mocks righteousness, faith still builds, still obeys, and still saves.
